Refer to and understand service policy 6.4, this is communicated with chn prior to excursion, supervision is paramount around and water source. 3. Ensure first aid kit is taken on all excursions and all wounds are cleaned, parents and service should be notified of incident prior to receiving written report, teach chn to voice when they have had an accident. 4. Be aware of chn's needs, signs and be willing to leave park if required. 5. Pair chn with an older child if possible, do regular head counts, teach and show children the boundaries/perimeter's of play upon arrival <p>(must remain aware of water changes at all time, running water, stagnate water, mosquito infested bodies of water and re assess the risk)</p>
