

EMPTY SPA Risk Management Plan

Please note: In the case of a filled spa all safety precautions and legislation must be adhered to and a pool safety certificate supplied regardless of the area being 'out of bounds'. If a spa remains empty, it must have a locked cover or suitable fence and a risk assessment

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The risk of death of a child in care from drowning or indeed for any reason is a tragedy and subsequently requires strict adherence to the current laws and legislation. Supervision is to be adhered to at all times.

As a service we require absolute adherence to those laws and ultimately to the safety of children in our care.
